

*Ask yourself these questions:*

1. Do you lose time from work due to gambling?
2. Does gambling make your home life unhappy?
3. Does gambling affect your reputation?
4. Do you ever feel remorse after gambling?
5. Do you ever gamble to get money with which to pay debts or to otherwise solve financial difficulties?
6. Does gambling cause a decrease in your ambition or efficiency?
7. After losing, do you feel you must return as soon as possible and win back your losses?
8. After a win, do you have a strong urge to return and win more?
9. Do you often gamble until your last dollar is gone?
10. Do you ever borrow to finance your gambling?
11. Do you ever sell anything to finance gambling?
12. Are you reluctant to use "gambling money" for normal expenditures?
13. Does gambling make you careless about the welfare of yourself and your family?
14. Do you ever gamble longer than you planned?
15. Do you ever gamble to escape worry or trouble?
16. Do you ever commit, or consider committing, an illegal act to finance your gambling?
17. Does gambling cause you to have difficulty sleeping?
18. Do arguments, disappointments or frustrations create within you an urge to gamble?
19. Do you have an urge to celebrate good fortune by a few hours of gambling?
20. Do you ever consider self-destruction as a result of your gambling?

If you can answer yes to at least seven of these questions, **YOU MAY HAVE A GAMBLING PROBLEM.**

# Let us HELP YOU help YOURSELF.

Most people consider gambling a fun and entertaining activity. However, for a few, gambling is not a pastime but a **compulsion**. It is something they need to do. Their daily lives become driven by an **uncontrollable** urge to gamble. And driven by whether they win or lose.

Compulsive gamblers can quickly reach a point of **desperation**. Their gambling habit directly affects their family, friends, even coworkers. It's a dangerous downward spiral that can spin out of control.

## Consider The Voluntrary Exclusion Program (VEP)

If you or someone you know has a gambling problem, the Voluntary Exclusion Program (VEP), offered by The Indiana Gaming Commission, may be the answer.

When a person enrolls in VEP, he or she agrees to refrain from entering any casino in Indiana. Should a VEP participant be found in an Indiana casino, he or she will be asked to leave and may be subject to arrest for trespassing. If a VEP participant wins a jackpot, that jackpot will be confiscated. VEP participants also lose eligibility for casino promotions, credits and comps.



Participants may join VEP for a period of one year, five years or life. They may increase this time period but not decrease it.

## Make an IMPORTANT first move.

VEP enrollment forms can be obtained from a French Lick Resort · Casino uniformed security guard, from uniformed guards at other casinos, and at the Indiana Gaming Commission office in Indianapolis. A person completing the form must do so of his or her own free will and must not be under the influence of alcoholic beverages, controlled substances, or prescription medication.
